Goal 19: Africa as a major partner in global affairs and peaceful co-existence



In November 2013, the United Arab Emirates (U.A.E.) won the bid to host Expo 2020 during a Bureau International Exhibition (BIE) general assembly held in Paris, France. This would be the first time it will be organized in the Middle East-Africa region (MEASA). The event, which is slated to be hosted in the city of Dubai will be organized under the theme **'Connecting Minds, Creating the Future'**. Essentially, it presents an opportunity for the region not only to share knowledge and innovation, but also to create partnerships between governments, industry and civil society to work towards ameliorating socio-economic challenges on the continent, and advancing the quality of life of its citizens.

The African Union (AU) has a significant role to play to ensure Africa's active participation in Expo 2020 Dubai. Indeed, the AU has reiterated its commitment to advance sustainable trade and industrial development on the continent through its Agenda 2063. This is highlighted in the organization's efforts to transform and industrialize Africa's economies, which include strategies on commodity value chain development; commodity exchanges for strategic African products, establishment of regional manufacturing hubs through public-private engagements, and scaling up of intra-regional trade among others.

Expo 2020 Dubai offers an opportunity to entrench the relationship between Africa and the UAE by leveraging the longstanding economic partnerships in the two regions. Moreover, the African Union's interest to participate in Expo 2020 Dubai is justified by the opportunity the Expo presents for the organization's quest to develop relevant partnerships to support the implementation of its Agenda 2063. The AU will aim to







capitalize on the strong concordance between the Expo 2020's themes **of opportunity, mobility and sustainability** and the Agenda's flagship initiatives and priority programs.

During the Thirty-Fourth (34th) Ordinary Session of the Assembly of the Union, held in February 2021, while highlighting the theme of the year 2021, the former AU Chairperson H.E. President Felix Tshisekedi said, Arts, Culture and Heritage constitute the foundation of the African renaissance and offers the opportunity for Africans to return to our roots. "Culture is indeed, as Léopold Sédar Senghor said, at the beginning and at the end of everything, because it embraces all areas of life". It is against this background that African Unity Day, commonly known as **Africa Day**, presents a golden opportunity to celebrate and promote African History, Arts, Culture and Heritage and officially open and launch AU's participation at the Expo.

Africa Honour Day

On 25 May 1963, Africa made history with the establishment of the Organization of African Unity (OAU) which brought the Continent together. Since then, 25 May has been celebrated widely across the world particularly in Africa to signify Africa's identity and unity.

In 2002, the OAU established its own successor, the African Union, to create a future with healthy, well educated people living in robust and developed economies. Indeed, this is a progressive march towards the "Africa we want" as envisioned in Agenda 2063. The African Union (AU)







is now fully operational in driving Agenda 2063 to realize its continental aspirations.

This year, the continental organization will celebrate 59 years of determined efforts for unity among the African people, and socioeconomic freedom from foreign dominion and exploitation. Given that Expo 2020 Dubai will take place from 1 October 2021 to 31 March 2022, the African Union Commission is calling on all AU Member States and officials, Regional Economic Communities, United Nations Agencies, European Union, International Organisations, Africans all over the world and in the Diaspora to join this celebration to commemorate and celebrate Africa Day at the Expo 2020 Dubai site on 27 February 2022 in Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

Objectives

More specifically, the celebration of Africa Day at Expo 2020 Dubai will aim to:

- 1. Mark the official participation of African Union at Expo 2020 Dubai;
- 2. Introduce African Arts, Culture and Heritage to the World;
- Promote AU Aspiration 5 "An Africa with a Strong Cultural Identity, Values and Ethics";
- Strengthen African cultural identity, values and ethics as well as a sense of a common destiny and African identity and Pan-African consciousness as a critical factor for Africa's emergence on the global stage;
- Recognize the role of African youth, women, traditional and religious leaders, including the youth as drivers of change;







6. Reaffirm the AU recognition of the role arts, culture and heritage can play as catalysts for the socio-economic development and integration of the African continent.

Africa Honour Day Celebrity Programme

The event will start in the AI WasI Plaza where the official ceremony will commence with flag raising followed by the singing of the AU Anthem in all official languages and speeches by UAE and AU officials. Following the opening, five artists from the five regions of Africa will perform before the officials and other guests will be taken from AI WasI on a guided tour in the AU and UAE pavilions respectively. After a photo opportunity and some gift exchanges, the officials will be taken to the leadership pavilion for camaraderie and continue to enjoy a full programme of cultural performances of African music and dialogues by African Talents, Youth and Women from all the five regions of the Continent and its Diaspora at Jubilee Park.
